What is your advice to young women who are looking to pursue a career in the legal field?

Actively cultivate relationships with good mentors. Even the best law school education can't match real world experience. Find someone who has had that experience and is willing to share it and don't be too cocky to listen to them and take their guidance to heart.

What is your advice to women who may lack confidence in their careers because of the stereotypes of women?

Know your strength and don't be afraid to advocate for yourself.

What strengths do women bring to the legal industry?

Working at Paley Rothman has really shown me that the idea of one gender or group having certain strengths in the legal field is an oversimplification. Rather, what each attorney brings to her practice is shaped by her own personal experience and strengths. The legal field was dominated by a very homogenous group of people for a very long time. Having more women and other attorneys with a greater variety of backgrounds and perspectives around the table makes the group as a whole better poised to identify creative solutions and challenge assumptions.
